Barbados lowered the Queen's flag ended its allegiance to the British royal family and severed more than 350 years of colonial ties to the monarchy. But who's present? That's then Prince Charles. Part of what Charles meant by that was that even though Barbados was no longer a realm of the British Crown it was remaining a member of the Commonwealth.
